A very warm welcome back to school. I trust you all enjoyed a safe and relaxing holiday with your families. We have 10 weeks of learning ahead of us and I thank teachers for spending their holidays preparing engaging units of work and lessons for students to engage with. As always, we have high expectations in terms of behaviour and attendance as only then can we maximise the outcomes and opportunities for growth for all students.

School Camp

A very big thank you to Murphy's Mobile Mechanics who have kindly donated \$500 towards school camp, reducing the cost further for families. With our P&C, student council and with this kind donation, our school camp has been reduced to \$175 per student. Families who have paid their \$50 deposit will only have \$125 left to pay. This amount must be paid in full by the end of term (ready for a Week 1 departure).

Beef Week


I am pleased to let you know that we have once again registered for the School's Beef Week excursion and our entire school will be attending Beef Week on Friday, 10th May. Units in English, Science and Design and Technologies are all aligned to agricultural practices. Beef Week will be a way to engage students in prior learning, vocabulary and real-life learning to consolidate lessons learnt, while also learn from experienced farmers in the agricultural industry to create their pieces of work. There will be no cost to students, as the school will subsidise the entire cost of the bus to and from the venue. We do ask, however, that students arrive at school a little early (by 8:45am) to ensure we arrive at our scheduled time for our first exhibit.

To ensure Beef Week is successful, we do ask for a couple of parent volunteers to assist with groupings of students. If you are a parent that is willing and able to assist, please reach out. In return, we would cover your gate fee and bus costs. Please be aware that only parents are exempt from Blue Card requirements. If grandparents, aunties, uncles etc. wish to assist, a Blue Card will need to be presented to school prior to the excursion.

Attendance

We finished Term 1 with 87.7% attendance. As a school, we would like to increase this to above 90% this term. We need strong attendance at school to enable students to access their supports and learning required to be successful at school. We have 26.8% of students with critically low attendance and letters have been attached to the newsletters of relevant families. Attendance was a Key Improvement Strategy in our recent review as the review team know how hard we are working for each and every child but when students aren't at school, that work and support gets lost. If you have received a letter for critically low attendance, I invite you to make a time with either myself or our Guidance Officer to discuss supports and strategies to lift your attendance in Term 2.











Prep/1 Class News-Week 1, Term 2

This term in Prep/1...

This term in the Prep/1 classroom, you just might hear the sound of farm animals! Our learnings will be based around farming. Students will also get the opportunity to go on an excursion to Beef Week (end of week 4), more details will be sent out closer to the date.

In this terms English unit, students will be exploring farm themed texts. They will be promoting farming and writing a persuasive text relating to farms.

In Science, students are learning about the different uses of the Earth's resources, in relation to farming. They will describe ways to conserve these resources, relating to conserving water on a farm and at school. In Maths, students are studying three different Mathematical learning areas, these include:

Number and Algebra-skip counting, patterning and collection of groups.

Measurement and Geometry-exploring event sequences, duration of time and telling time. Statistics and Probability-classifying outcomes.

We have a very busy and exciting term ahead of us. We will also be creating art pieces to enter into the Ridgelands and Rockhampton Show. We look forward to sharing these with you throughout the term!

What we're learning

English and Science

In Science and English, students will delve into the dynamic processes that shape our planet. They will explore how both natural phenomena and human activities lead to significant changes in Earth's surface. Through hands-on experiments, they'll investigate the process of erosion, meticulously recording and comparing their observations to their initial predictions, and learning to articulate their findings effectively. They will also propose an effective solution to erosion on farms.

Math

First up for math this term, students will be focusing on Time. This can be a difficult unit for many students, so we will include lots of hands on learning and repeated exposure. This unit is a great opportunity to get involved at home by using a house schedule, calendar, or time table. Students will encounter both analogue and digital time in this unit.









Design Technologies

This term students will complete a design technologies unit that focuses on new and old technologies to harvest, process and prepare food. For there assessment task, students will design and create a healthy snack that includes the use of both new and old technologies.

HASS

Students are engaging in a unique and insightful project: creating a detailed profile of a farmer. This activity is designed to deepen their understanding of agricultural life, the challenges faced by farmers, and the critical role agriculture plays in our society. Additionally, we will be exploring the importance of laws and how they impact not only our daily lives but also the broader community and the envi-





Porty's four schoolwide expectations... Safe Responsible Respectful Learners









Hi Porty families and welcome to the first PBL newsletter for Term 2.

This fortnight we will be focusing on positive behaviour when transitioning into the classroom from the playground. We will also be focusing on school routines and self-regulation.

Teaching children self-regulation at home is an essential skill that can positively impact their behaviour, emotional well-being, and overall success in life.

Model Self-Regulation: Children learn by example, so it's important to model self-regulation yourself. Show them how you manage your emotions, handle stress, and cope with challenging situations calmly and effectively.

Provide Structure and Routine: Establishing consistent routines and structure can help children feel secure and understand what to expect. Predictability can reduce anxiety and make it easier for children to regulate their emotions and behaviour.

Teach Emotional Awareness: Help children identify and label their emotions. Encourage them to express how they're feeling and validate their emotions. Use books, games, or activities to teach them about different emotions and how to recognize them in themselves and others.

Set Clear Expectations and Limits: Clearly communicate your expectations and establish age-appropriate rules and limits. Consistency is key, so be firm but fair in enforcing boundaries. Help children understand the consequences of their actions and encourage them to take responsibility for their behaviour.

- · Lining up sensibly/responsibly as per classroom routine.
- Make responsible choices and follow classroom rules in terms of tolleting /drinks/before lining up.
- Stop play and move to line up area as soon as the bell rings and be ready to move to classrooms by second boll
- Enter class ready to learn. Enter in a safe and colm manner, use self-regulation strateges if needed.
- · Walk safely up the stairs.
- Keep noise to a minimum when entering the classroom.
- Close and open doors respectfully.
